Special Election in January

The Board has open seats and will have a special election on January 7th.

Anyone age 16 or older who lives within the North End boundaries is invited to attend and is eligible to vote or seek election. Three seats are available in Quadrant 4, which covers the northeastern portion of the North End, including the McDonough Homes. Two open seats are available in Quadrant 1, which covers the southeastern portion of the North End around Oakland Cemetery. Candidates for these seats must live in the Quadrant they would represent.

In addition, one open youth seat for a resident (16 – 21 years old) in any quadrant is open

Solar Motion Lights


The North End Neighborhood Organization has received a grant from Council President Amy Brendmoen's Year
